

6 signs your brakes need an inspection

And what those signs could be trying to tell you...

Your brake warning light is illuminated



Could mean: Your vehicle is experiencing hydraulic failure. You might also feel a low brake pedal.

Your brake pedal or steering wheel vibrates or pulsates when brakes are applied



Could mean: If the issue is caused by your ABS, you'll notice a mechanical pulsation.

If it's because of warped brake rotors, you'll feel a wobble through the steering wheel when you apply the brakes.

Your car pulls to one side when braking



Could mean: Your calipers or wheel cylinders are seized.

You hit the brakes harder or it takes longer to stop



Could mean: One brake or axle isn't performing the way it's supposed to.

Your brakes make a squealing, grinding or scraping sound



Could mean: Your brakes are worn.

Your brake pedal has fallen



Could mean: There's air in your system or a mechanical failure.

To help keep your brakes working safely for the benefit of everyone, get your brakes checked once a year and as soon as you notice a change in performance or sounds.
